

History Corner

Kathleen Norris 1880-1966

Palo Alto Kathleen Norris made a fortune from the novels she wrote; enough to have built a home in Palo Alto that still remains beautiful. She was so famous in her time that she was featured on a cover of Time magazine in 1935.

What reminded me of her was an article in the New Yorker about the Belgian author, Georges Simenon, born in 1903. I first heard of Simenon when I was a student of comparative literature at the University of Brussels. He wrote nearly 200 novels, Norris wrote 80, but both of them profited grandly from their works.

I had previously read and liked Norris, and I thought now that I would go to the library and choose from, perhaps only 40 of her books, since she was so notable a local. To my astonishment, the Palo Alto Library has a total of two, plus one about San Francisco, where she was born, in the Z collection (that must be read in the library.)

I started to read *Certain People of Importance*, which is excellent for showing what life was really like for people of Marin County and San Francisco in the 1880s. Girls had effectively one option in life, and that was marriage. Among the people in the book who make it real: Hispanic ranchers who still spoke Spanish and lived in the hospitable style of their culture, an Indian man who worked for them, Easterners who came West for work, and Americans for whom class featured large. A recommended read.
